Title:	Two children died of fever, all 301 hospital beds full in Raebareli, Uttar Pradesh			
Action By CSU, IDSP –NCDC	Information communicated to DSU – Raebareli, SSU- Uttar Pradesh			

Due to rain and change in weather, the outbreak of fever and diarrhea has increased in the district. Two children admitted to the district hospital died while 22 patients were admitted on Monday. All 301 beds of the hospital are full. There is no space left even in the Pediatric ICU. Children have been admitted on all the beds. Considering the number of patients, CMS has arranged for 20 more beds.

Atya (nine months) of Bhik village of Jagatpur area and Vaishnavi (three), a resident of Bharatganj, who were admitted to the district hospital, died during treatment. Both the children were admitted after having fever and other problems. Apart from this, Himanshi (12), Vidya (60), Ayushi (5), Vishal (26), Sundar (63), Mohd. Lucky (2), Ramvati (70), Khushi (3), Raj (15), Mahi (4), Varsha (9), Parvati (53), Sunita (24), Jai (15), Anjali (30), Kamta (37), Sajeevan (34), Ramkhelavan (20), Vimal (22), Sunita (32) have been admitted. Sonam and Sadhna's newborn has also been admitted after contracting fever. There are 301 beds available in the district hospital. There are patients on almost all the beds. A separate arrangement for 20 beds has been made in emergency, so that serious patients can be admitted and given treatment facilities. Patients related to cold, fever and diarrhea have also increased in OPD. Since morning, there was a crowd of patients on the counters ranging from pamphlets to medicine and pathology. Patients suffering from heat waited outside the OPD rooms for medical advice.
