

Title:	Jaipur reports 155% spike in dengue cases, 1 dead, Rajasthan

The state has witnessed sudden spike in dengue cases with the numbers doubling in the past 19 days. In Jaipur, cases have increased by a whopping 155% in addition to reporting malaria infections for the first time. Jaipur reported its first dengue death of 2022 on Wednesday. It was the fifth dengue death of the state in 2022.

Between September 8 and 27, the state logged 1,978 dengue cases, in sharp contrast to 1,603 cases being reported from January 1 to September 8. In the past 19 days, cases have more than doubled and it has gone up by 123%.

A health department official said they have issued directions to all the districts to intensify anti-larvae activities. Out of 1,201 dengue cases reported in Jaipur from January 1 to September 27, 730 were reported just 19 days. He said people also need to be careful as they have checked the breeding of mosquitoes in their houses and surroundings.

In Jaipur, no case of malaria was reported from January 1 to September 8. But for the first time, eight cases have reported in the city since September 9. Following Jaipur, Dausa has reported second highest number of cases of dengue. Till September 27, Dausa has reported 232 cases, Barmer (185), Alwar (166), Udaipur (161), Karauli (156) and Tonk (156). In 2021, the state had reported 96 dengue deaths, the highest in the country.
