







Out of these samples, 13 tested positive for Japanese Encephalitis (IgM ELISA). 4 deaths were reported: 51-year-old female on 25.06.2025, 36-year-old male on 12.07.2025, and a 6-year-old female on 13.07.2025. The cause of 4 deaths was confirmed to be Japanese Encephalitis. IEC activities and vector control measures were conducted. Fever surveillance was conducted and fogging operations were carried out. Community awareness and health education given by peripheral team on vector control measures, health seeking behaviour, vaccination, hygiene and sanitation

Vector control measures were undertaken. Community awareness was given. Source Reduction
