Tally rises to 264; situation under control, say health officials

Diarrhoea outbreak continues to wreak havoc in Jhill village of the district. As many as 37 fresh cases were reported from the village today. With this, the number of people falling sick due to diarrhoea outbreak at the village rose to 264.

Health officials, however, claimed that the situation is under control because there is evidently a decline in the number of hospitalisations. Only six diarrhoea patients were admitted to hospitals in the past 24 hours, said the Health Department.

Notably, 38 villagers have been admitted to hospitals ever since the outbreak was reported on Wednesday. Of 38 patients, 20 have been discharged, while 18 are still undergoing treatment in hospitals here.

The Patiala Civil Surgeon, along with other officials, visited Jhill village and met residents, who had diarrhoea symptoms. He said five teams of health officials were holding group meetings in the village to create awareness about the disease.



The health officials said lab reports of water samples were being awaited. However, stool samples of the diarrhoea patients ruled out the role of cholera in the diarrhoea outbreak.

Cases detected in city too

Diarrhoea cases were also reported from the Bishan Nagar area of Patiala city on Friday. During a routine OPD, the Health Department detected seven diarrhoea cases. Dr Parneet, Medical Officer, Bishan Nagar, said they didn't see situation of any outbreak. "Considering weather conditions, these are routine cases. However, we are conducting a house-to-house survey in the area to prevent any outbreak."

Dip in hospitalisations: Officials

Health officials, however, claimed that the situation is under control because there is evidently a decline in the number of hospitalisations. Only six diarrhoea patients were admitted to hospitals in the past 24 hours, said the Health Department.

18 still admitted to hospitals
