






The affected age group was 25-42. 5 blood samples were sent to the Microbiology Department, Medical College Dimrapal, Jagdalpur for Leptospirosis IgM ELISA testing, and all were found positive for <i>Leptospira</i>. Community awareness and health education given by the peripheral team on control measures, hygiene and sanitation.</p>

Cases were of two families who developed symptoms after consuming local frogs, Umbrella- Mushroom, Rice, Dal, Fish curry, Handia. Cases were treated at RH Jasodanga. 8 Stool, Rectal Swab, and serum samples were collected from 8 admitted patients & sent to the NBMCH for Microbiological testing. No salmonella, Shigella, Vibrio organism growth was found in culture. Aeromonas hydrophila found in 2 samples, & E. coli found in 1 sample. House to House visit done at affected areas to find out any hidden or not reported cases. 2 deaths were reported in a 27-year-old male on 23/09/25 and a 35-year-old male on 21/09/25 due to the illness. Awareness was done in the community regarding hygiene maintenance while preparing food, and warning signs of dehydration.</p>
