

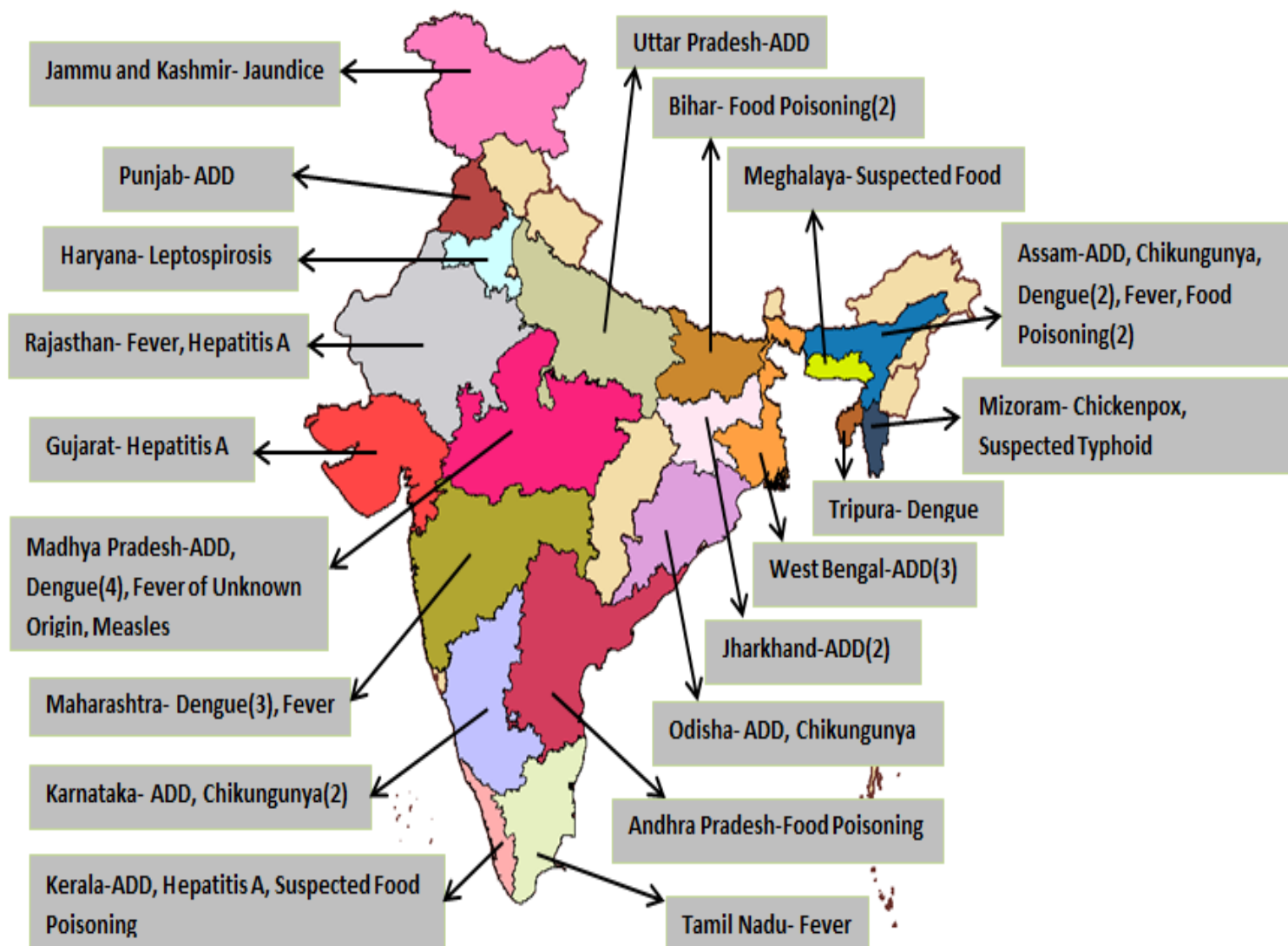

35th Week Map

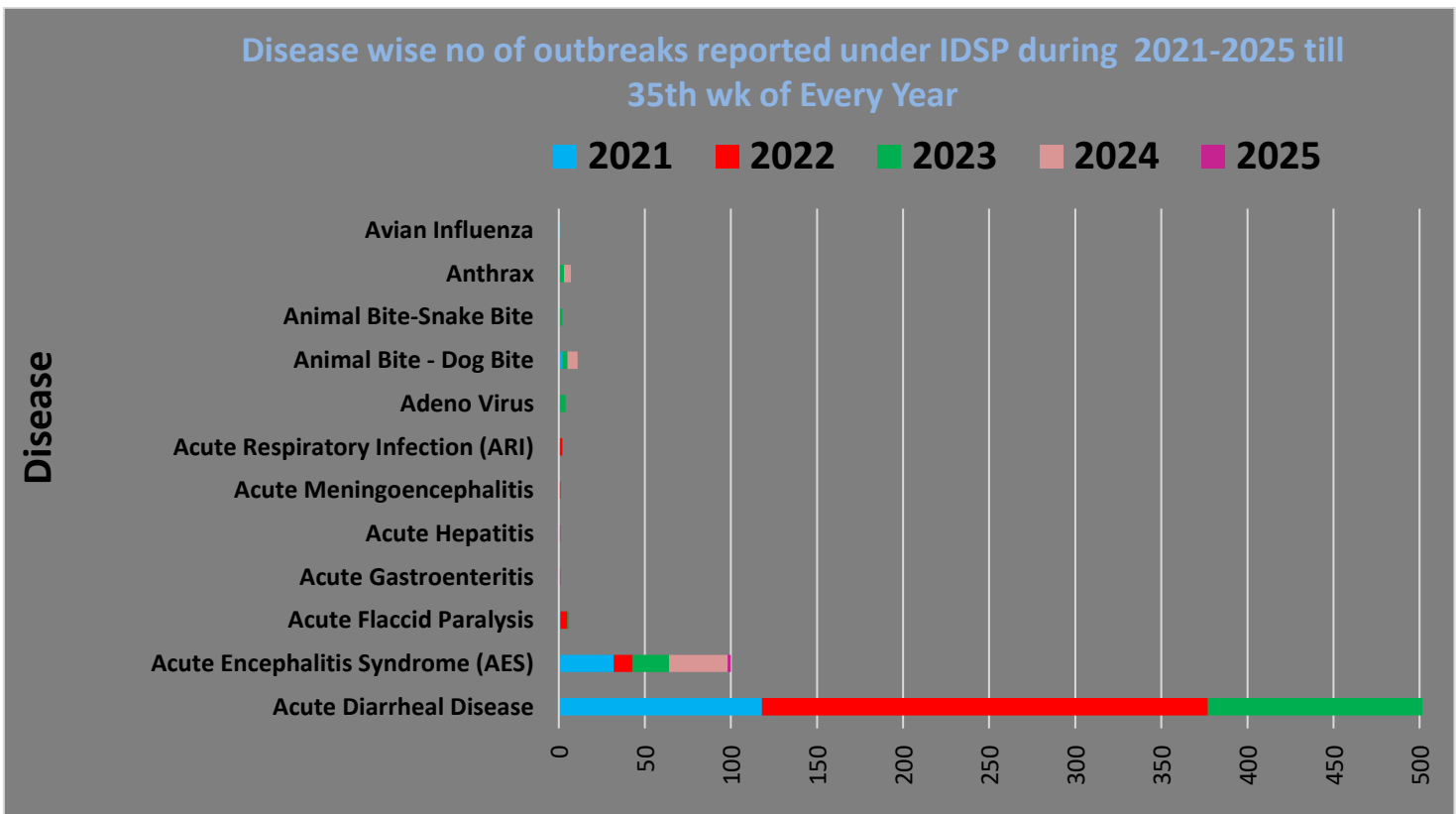
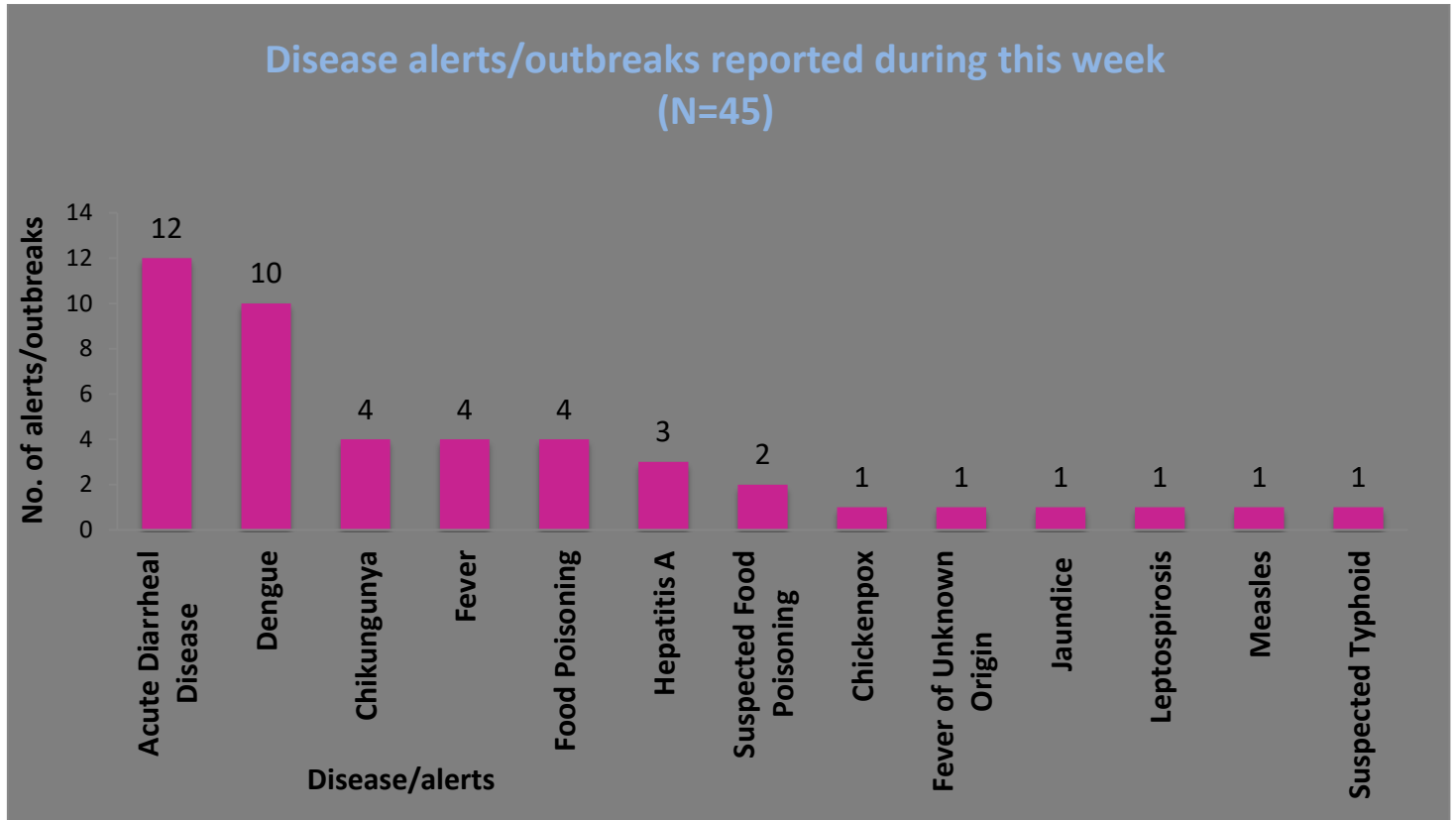

All 4 stool samples collected and sent to Apollo Hospital, Aragonda tested negative for cholera by culture. Community awareness and health education given by the peripheral team on safe food habits, hygiene and sanitation.

Distribution of insecticide-treated bed nets (ITBN), source reduction, mosquito breeding source (MBS) survey, BT spray, fogging and leaflet distribution were carried out. Culture results revealed Salmonella enterica serovar Typhimurium in the rectal swabs, while 3 of the water samples were found not potable.
