Title:	2 of family die after eating 'puri-sabzi' in Kannauj district, Uttar Pradesh

Two minor sisters died while six other members of the family fell ill after consuming 'puri-sabzi' in Kannauj district on Sunday.

The ill family members have been admitted to the district hospital, from where one of them has been referred to Farrukhabad. District Magistrate Kannauj has ordered a probe into the incident.

Shyamveer, a resident of Mohalla Kayasthan in Taalgram police area works in a private firm in Delhi.

His wife Pinki and children live in Kannauj. On Sunday morning, gourd vegetable and puri was prepared in the house. Shyamveer, his wife and daughters and the children of his two brothers had eaten it.

Shyamveer and wife Pinky's health deteriorated in the night. Both showed themselves to a private doctor. The doctor referred Pinki to the Higher Centre in Farrukhabad.

Meanwhile, the health of Shyamveer's brother Ritik and a daughter, Priya (8) deteriorated, both were rushed to a doctor.

After this, when his family members reached home, Shyamveer's two other daughters, seven-year-old Ritika and 13-year-old Riya, were found dead.

The health of the two daughters of Shyamveer's brother Sanjeev, Janvi and Manvi, who lived in the neighborhood, also deteriorated. Shyamveer's younger brother Ram Avatar's handicapped 15-year-old daughter Uma too fell ill. All have been admitted to the district hospital.

District Magistrate Rakesh Kumar Mishra has ordered a probe and also sent the additional district magistrate and a deputy SP-rank officer on the spot for investigation.

Additional district magistrate Gajendra Kumar said that the victims had eaten 'puri-sabzi' on Sunday afternoon. "They probably became victims of food poisoning by eating contaminated food. Their condition deteriorated late on Sunday night and by Monday morning two minor girls had died. A team of the food department has been sent to the spot to investigate and submit a report in this regard," he added.
